Minutes of the Meeting of Birtley Parish Council held in the Supper Room of Birtley Village Hall starting at 8.00 pm. on 3rd December 2013.

Minutes Minutes of the meeting held on 6th August 2013 were agreed and signed by the Chairman.

Matters Arising

- ➤ Play Area The Clerk has received a (discounted) quote of £150 for the yearly inspection. The Chairman will pursue other quotes including Playsafe/Boyds. There has been some issues over the emptying of the park wheelie bin and this is because it is coloured brown. Cllr Gibson will contact NEAT Services to see if it could be replaced by a green one.
- ➤ Weeds especially Broadleafed Dockweed, *Rumex crispus*, Cllr Robson thanked Cllr Burn for clearance of dock and pernicious weeds.
- ➤ **Dog Fouling** Cllr Robson made some signs and had them displayed at the top of the village but these signs soon disappeared. However the dog fouling problem seems to have gone away.

Correspondence All councillors were circulated with a full list of correspondence.

• NNPA The Sill Project National Park offered to come to a parish council meeting to provide information on this project. It was thought that a presentation wasn't necessary and the Clerk provided information to the Council instead.

- **Don't stand for it campaign** Some dog fouling has been reported. It was noted that it is an offence to not immediately pick up after your dog has fouled on any publically accessible land. Offenders can face an on-the-spot fine of £75 and if prosecuted, a fine of up to £1000 if they fail to pick up after their dog(s). The Clerk to contact the Public Protection Officer and see if it is possible to arrange a visit from the Animal Welfare and Dog Control Team.
- Annual Audit this was completed free of charge by BDO LLB Southampton.

Grant Applications

Cemex has given the Council £250 making the total received to date of £6,250. Cllr Gibson stated that he would allocate £2,000 from NCC Members Local Improvement Schemes 2013/14. Cllr Burn has applied to Awards for All and he will liaise with Community Foundation to update them and investigate the possibility of applying in the next round of applications. Tarmac has not replied to our application and Hanson has said no. Sir James Knott Trust will only fund charities and the Housing Developer Funders s106 Money didn't like our project.
